City Of Lynchburg's 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan

City's Community Development Advisory Committee Accepting Public Comments Regarding the Plan

Tonight, Tuesday, February 3 at 6:30 p.m., the Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC), appointed by City Council to serve as an advisory board for administering the CDBG and HOME programs, will meet at the Miller Center, 301 Grove Street, Room 304, to accept public comments regarding the proposed goals for the City's 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan.

The Five-Year Consolidated Plan is designed to be a collaborative process whereby the community establishes a unified vision for community development actions. This is an opportunity for City residents, public, community organizations, and agencies to provide input on identifying the needs the Consolidated Plan will address and strategies for implementing those needs through established goals and priorities.

Heritage High School Update:



The top five ongoing activities for the new Heritage High School include:

- Heavy earth moving at the new bus turn-around loop
- Pouring concrete slabs
- Steel erection
- Masonry wall erection
- Installation of under-slab utilities

Fun statistics include:

- A total of 554 tons of steel have been installed to date.
- Just over 70,000 man hours have been worked to date.
- There will be 400,000 bricks in the skin of the building.
- There are 480,000 concrete masonry blocks in the structure.
- There will be 20,000 bags of mortar used on the building.
- There will be 1,800 yards of grout fill in CMU block walls.
