City Wins Silver Circle Award

The City of Lynchburg's Communications and Marketing Department was awarded the Silver Circle Award from the City-County Communications and Marketing Association (3CMA) for its Communications Plan for the Lynchburg Alerts program.



Lynchburg Alerts is the Reverse 9-1-1 program that was launched earlier this year and gives the City the ability to contact residents during an emergency. First to Know is the subscription part of the program that allows citizens to register in order to receive important information about street closures, public meetings, etc.

The Department initiated an extensive public education and marketing plan to promote Lynchburg Alerts and to encourage residents to register for the program.

In reviewing the program, the 3CMA judges said, "This entry had great impact statements: 'If We Can't Reach You, We Can't Alert You!' and 'First to Know.' The monthly giveaways and grand prize seemed to generate excitement and raise the success. The advertisements were varied, yet had a consistent overall look and feel—this is difficult to achieve."
