School Registration Frequently Asked Questions

When do I register my child for the 2013-2014 school year?

ALL SCHOOLS (except Bass): August 20, 2013, 12:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Do I need to bring proof of residency such as utility bills, rent/mortgage agreement to registration?

Yes. Be prepared to provide two current forms of proof of residency. This applies to both new and returning students for all schools. A driver's license is not considered a proof of residency. If you do not have two forms of proof, and you and/or your children are living with someone else in the city, you need to provide the division a notarized letter from the person with whom you are living, stating: that the parent/guardian and child are residing with them at this address, and the date they moved to this address. If a family is homeless and living in a temporary shelter within the city, the children will be accepted into school upon receipt of the documentation from the shelter administrator.

Does my child need a birth certificate to enter school?

Yes. Each new student entering Lynchburg City Schools for the first time must have a state issued birth certificate. If you do not have this document, go to www.lcsedu.net for a link to a copy of the Commonwealth of Virginia Application for Certification of a Vital Record. Returning LCS students do not need to bring their birth certificate.

Does my child need a social security card to enter school?

Each new student entering Lynchburg City Schools for the first time needs to bring their child's Social Security card. If you do not have this document, go to www.lcsedu.net for a link to download the Social Security Administration Application for a Social Security card. For non-U.S. born children who do not have social security numbers, please contact your child's school to make arrangements for proper documentation.

Does my child need a physical each year before entering school?

Any child entering any public school for the first time must have a comprehensive physical exam by a qualified licensed physician within 12 months prior to entering school. Any transfer student enrolling in Lynchburg City Schools for the first time from another state must have a comprehensive physical exam by a qualified licensed physician within 12 months prior to entry.



What shots will my child need to enter school?

Generally, shots are needed for children entering Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, and Sixth Grade. Go to www.lcsedu.net to see requirements.

What if my student needs medication at school?

The medication authorization form is available at www.lcsedu.net, from the school clinic at registration, or by calling school administration at 515-5000. This form must be completed by the doctor, and it must accompany any medication that is brought to the school. The medication will be locked in the school's clinic.

When is pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and 6th grade orientation?

All schools (except Bass): August 22, 2013

When is 9th-grade orientation?

- E. C. Glass High School: August 20, 2013 from 9:00 a.m. to Noon.
- Heritage High School: August 6, 2013, Session 1: Noon-2:30 p.m.; Session 2: 5:00 p.m.-7:30 p.m.

How is orientation different from registration?

Orientation is an opportunity for students transitioning into the pre-K, Kindergarten, 6th grade and 9th grade to learn what to expect for the first day of school. For Pre-K, Kindergarten and 6th-grade orientation, parents and students can be picked up by their bus and taken to the school for orientation. A bus schedule will be given during registration. Buses will bring parents and students home later that morning. Transportation is not included in the 9th grade orientation.

Can we sign up for free/reduced breakfast/lunch at registration?

Yes. Families with financial need are encouraged to complete an application for free/reduced meals. The students' privacy is kept so that there is no way to distinguish between those who get free/reduced meals and those who don't.
