Free Clinic For Immunizations And Physicals

Lynchburg City Schools is partnering with the Centra Mobile Med, a free clinic on wheels, to provide services to children and adults this summer.

Dates: August 11 & 12

Place: Park View Community Mission, 2420 Memorial Avenue

BY APPOINTMENT ONLY - CALL (434) 665-8233 TO SCHEDULE

Services for children will include:

- Immunizations for children with Medicaid and those without insurance (and T-Dap for 6th graders)
- Preschool readiness physicals

Services for adults will include:

- Management of diabetes and high blood pressure
- Upper respiratory infection, urinary tract infection, seasonal allergies, muscle aches
- Pink eye
- Skin rashes and other various illnesses

What you need to bring:

- Copy of child’s latest immunization record
- Picture ID
- If someone other than the parent is accompanying the child, bring a written letter of permission from the parent consenting to the treatment or proof of custody of the child.



Free Summer Meals

Don’t forget to take advantage of the Free Summer Meals for all children 18 and under at R. S. Payne and Perrymont Elementary Schools. Free meals will be served through August 7.

Registration For 2015-2016 School Year

Online registration is open for ALL STUDENTS. Families are encouraged to complete online registration by August 10. The division-wide Registration Day to finalize the registration process will be held on August 11 (for all schools except Bass).

There are three ways to register online:

- Returning parents register through your Parent Portal account. A link in your Parent Portal will take you straight to the online registration application. If you do not have a Parent Portal account, contact your child’s school to get the code to set this up. Registering through your Parent Portal account saves you time because most of your information will already be entered.
- New parents can register at www.lcsedu.net/olr. You will be asked to provide your name and email address. The link to the online registration application will be sent to the email address you provided to validate and create your account.
- For parents unable to access the internet, LCS will have kiosks set up at various school sites for you to use. Simply contact the school your child will be attending or the School Administration Office to set up a time to use a kiosk.
