2013 will bring great changes to the Miller Center

Built in 1911, the Miller Center served as an elementary school until 1965, when it became the home of a community center and the Parks and Recreation Department administrative offices. The building has had many minor changes throughout the years, but this long-scheduled renovation will move the 20th century building firmly into the 21st century.

Extensive renovations mean that classes and programs will be impacted this fall. The neighborhood center will close at the end of August 2012 and the entire building will be closed to the public in January of 2013. Administrative and programming staff will move to other locations, and classes and other activities will operate at different locations. Please bear with us as we undergo this major renovation. Pay special attention to the brochures, website and facebook for information on your favorite class and program. Unfortunately some programs will be discontinued until the renovation is complete.

The renovation includes energy-efficient building systems, a new elevator tower, restoration of the existing theater, renovated classrooms, a new kitchen, a renovated and larger neighborhood center, a new roof, improved parking, restrooms, new offices, and many other changes.
